The new gutters have been installed at the library. The black color really makes the gutters blend into the building. It is our hope they help with flood abatement. The handicap lift has also been repaired. It turns out there are three hinges on the side of the door. The bottom hinge was broken. It is now repaired and the lift is working. I mentioned we felt this repair should be covered by the maintenance fee we paid just a few weeks ago. So far Access elevator seems to agree with us. I sent the accounts department, contact name and phone number, over to Scott.

Just in case there is any more questions concerning billing. I would like to thank Bereneta Terry for coming over to the library and weeding our flower beds. programs. This number does not include adults who attended the programs. Sixty- four adults came along for the ride, and joined in to participate or help out. It was fun. I'm hoping some of these same adults return for our fall adult programming!
